
Mission

- Strengthen Colombia's dual role as a recipient of Official Development Assistance (ODA) and a provider of South-South and triangular cooperation (SSTrc), positioning the country as a reference in international cooperation for sustainable development.

- Produce high-quality, timely, and relevant information to support decision-making in international cooperation for development.
