
### **Mission**

To promote independence in the management of international development cooperation funds through investment and partnerships

To ensure the implementation of international development cooperation be more transparent, efficient, effective, accountable, and sustainable.

Eligible countries for funding include leastdeveloped or developing nations, small island countries, and those with established diplomatic relations with Indonesia.

- In 2024, Indonesia pledged over USD 30 million for grant-funded projects supporting developing countries.

- Disaster risk reduction expertise was shared with Nepal and Sri Lanka, drawing on Indonesia's posttsunami recovery experience.
- Indonesia partnered with Japan and Australia to implement blended funding for scaling up its food security and climate resilience initiatives
